76 New Cases - 4,526 Cases Total in Livingston County

Livingston County, IL – Seventy-six residents of Livingston County have tested positive for COVID-19 (coronavirus disease). Sadly, two more residents have also died due to complications related to COVID-19. The individuals were females in their 90s. Livingston County Health Department (LCHD) officials were notified of the new COVID-19 cases and deaths between April 6-12, 2021 in accordance with state and local public health protocol.

As of April 12, 2021, the LCHD has received 97,902 COVID-19 test results. Of that, 4,526 COVID-19 tests have been positive, 93,376 tests were negative, 4,370 of the previously reported cases have been removed from isolation, 73 cases remain active, and, sadly, 83 cases have resulted in death due to complications related to COVID-19. COVID-19 testing is available in Livingston County at local pharmacies, including Walgreens and CVS, by appointment. Drive-thru and walk-up testing is also available at the Interstate Center (1106 Interstate Dr, Bloomington, IL) every Monday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday from 9:00am to 5:00pm.

Individuals who travel to hot spots in the country, those areas where higher rates of confirmed COVID-19 cases are reported, are strongly encouraged to get tested for COVID-19 5-7 days after returning from their trip or sooner if experiencing symptoms.
